OVERVIEW OF COURSE STRUCTURE

The four-year JSPC curriculum consists of a mix of core and specialized courses covering the fascinating field of psychology and its many subdisciplines. General elective courses are offered by all schools of JGU, designed to ensure students gain broad exposure to fields of study outside psychology. Students also participate in practicums and skill-based courses, intended to ground theoretical learning in hands-on, real-world experience. Finally, students must complete internships during their winter and/or summer breaks, facilitating student engagement with disparate psychological professionals and organizations.

The Psychology Research Laboratory provides a modern workspace for all faculty and students of Psychology at JGU. A variety of psychophysiological and behavioural equipment, including EEG and eye-tracking hardware, permits a direct examination of the brain and behaviour. The laboratory has space for student instruction—providing ample opportunity for students to gain first-hand training and understanding in experimental design and analysis. SCHOLARSHIPS

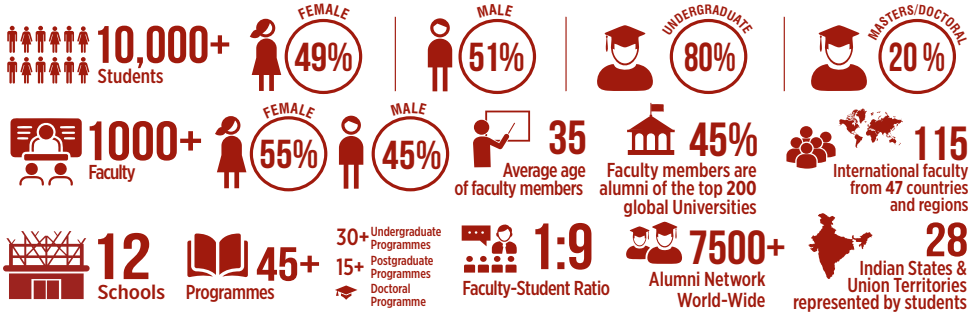
